Woodlands NUSD Survey Findings

Earlier this year, The Woodlands Association commissioned a survey to see how residents of our community feel about the proposed effort to create a new Northgate Unified K-12 school district (NUSD) separate from the Mount Diablo Unified School District (MDUSD). As noted in the March newsletter, response to the survey was strong, with over 80 respondents, with 66% supporting the effort to create a new district. Overall, respondents indicated a high level of knowledge about the initiative and process, with 92% indicating they were either 'Very Familiar' (64%) or 'Fairly Familiar' (28%) with it.

Engagement with the process was high as well, with 73% or respondents having signed the petition requesting the County Board of Education and the California Department of Education to review the request to create a new school district, and 35% indicating that they had volunteered or participated in the process to create NUSD, or expressed an interest in doing so.

Those expressing support for the initiative indicated a desire for more accountable district leadership (75%) and more local control (72%). As one respondent noted, "MDUSD has always been too large to give attention (Continued on Pg. 3)

Northgate Unified: A Dangerous Gamble

NorthgateUNCAPPED, a coalition of educators, community members, civic leaders, and representatives of local civil rights organizations was formed to oppose the movement to create a Northgate Unified School District. With the limited information provided to petition signers, we believe that community members did not receive the full picture regarding costs, programming, and the neighboring schools excluded from the new proposed "community" school district.

Our Northgate feeder pattern schools are dynamic, innovative learning communities that foster high levels of student engagement and success. The positive growth that the Mount Diablo Unified School District has seen over the last three years shapes and supports student life at all of the Northgate feeder pattern schools.

Thanks to a strong partnership with Mount Diablo Unified School District, Bancroft Elementary School maintains a thriving Dual Immersion K-2 Program, providing students the opportunity to develop academic language proficiency in English and Spanish, master grade level core standards and develop cultural proficiency. The \$300,000 in funding from the Tesoro Corporation, the result of a long established connection with the Mount Diablo Unified School District, supports a thriving after-school

Ygnacio Canal Trail Repair

The trail between Ygnacio Valley Road and the dead end of Rock Oak Road will be closed off between Rock Oak Rd. and Bayberry Rd. from roughly mid-April through roughly mid-June. Join Your Woodlands Neighbors, and Volunteer

Since 1998, John Muir Health's Caring Hands program has been helping seniors age independently in their own homes as long as safely possible. As we know, the number of seniors is expanding rapidly. Most of us don't want to make a move if we can avoid it.

Many Woodlands community residents have stepped up to help. Those who can spare from 1-3 hours a week receive training and are carefully matched with a frail or isolated senior in their community to help with doctor's appointments, social outings, visits, or grocery shopping. Sometimes a volunteer will simply visit and chat or reminisce with his or her match. A walk in the park or a trip to the cafe for coffee can be just what an isolated senior needs to brighten the day.

Currently Caring Hands has almost 50 seniors waiting for a volunteer. Please consider helping. Hours are flexible, older volunteers are welcome, and the program offers a comprehensive training once applicants have been interviewed and screened. Dr. Patrick Arbore of the Institute on Aging said, "Social isolation is a risk factor; connection a protective factor. Just one person who says "I'm here for you" is profound."

to the individual schools". Other reasons receiving strong support included the desire for a smaller school district and lack of confidence in current district leadership (both 68%). One respondent summed up their support noting "As long as Northgate can receive adequate funding, I think Northgate's secession from MDUSD would have a positive impact on the Woodlands community".

A smaller number of respondents expressed concern or opposition to the proposal, with 26% of respondents indicating that a smaller district would be less efficient than a larger one, and 25% saying they did not see problems with the existing MDUSD. A number of respondents commented that the survey choices against the new district failed to adequately capture the best reasons to oppose it. Additional reasons cited in the comments included concerns about the impact on special education programs, issues regarding funding and taxation, and concerns that the new district lacks diversity. One commenter noted "It is bad for the students due to a lack of diversity, a loss of special programs, an exodus of teachers. And it will cost more", with another posting "This is a waste of resources and energy... it is not a benefit to teachers or students in the long run".

A few commenters spoke more specifically about the impact of the discussion on the community, and concerns about the tone and level of discourse "I am very sad at the discord this has caused in our community. There was a thread on NextDoor earlier this month that was simply ugly in tone. Neighbors were calling each other names, and there was a hostility that made me very uncomfortable. At the end of the day, we all need to still live together, and one side will be happy and one will not. What happens then?"

Update on NUSD Process

Over the past few months, you have seen a number of updates and opinion articles here in regards to the petition to create a locally elected Northgate School District. The goal of the Woodlands Board of Directors is to ensure that you hear from all sides equally and ensure that you understand the process and facts. This article is to help explain the process and what is next, key dates are fast approaching.

The Contra Costa County Division of Election has certified the results of the petition, which required 25% of registered voters to sign. We have been informed that 57.2% of voters in the Woodlands signed the petition.

Under California State law, spelled out in the Education Code, the Contra Costa County Board of Education and the Redistricting Committee, composed of the five elected Trustees will review the request to form a new school district. The request is not taken lightly as the Education Code sets forth that nine criteria will need to be met. This criteria includes but is not limited to financial viability, demographic information, ensuring that special needs students will have adequate programing and staffing and that programs currently offered will not be impacted.

In order to ensure the criteria is met the BOE has retained a consultant to conduct a study. Furthermore, Northgate CAPS, the organization which organized the petition, has hired a consultant. The Trustees, which compose the Redistricting Committee will get to review both reports and will vote to either move the process forward or find that it fails to meet the state criteria. Following the review by the County, the State Department of Education will appoint a special redistricting committee to assess the findings. Again determining if the new district would meet the states requirements for viability. After that process is concluded the issue will go to a vote of the people.

On April 18th the Walnut Creek City Council will vote to put forth a resolution on NUSD. The resolution provides support from the city and recommends that the voting area be only NUSD territory (approximately 20,000 voters) versus all of Mt. Diablo (approximately 160,000 voters). Due to timing of the resolution to when we print this newsletter, we can't say if the resolution was adopted but will plan to update our Facebook page and Web site with the information. Five members of the City Council as well as nine previous Mayors of Walnut Creek have endorsed the NUSD petition.

May 2nd and 3rd at 6 p.m. are dates the County has provided for public hearings on this matter. We encourage all to attend and voice your opinion. The hearing will take place at the Board of Education 77 Santa Barbara Rd, Pleasant Hill, CA 94523 If you cannot attend the hearings but you wish to voice your opinion you can send a letter or E-mail to the Trustees.






