



Woodlands Community Crime Meeting - March 7th, 7pm, Valle Verde MUR

With the issue of McDonald's no longer a relevant issue for our neighborhood, the Woodland's Association has turned its attention to the issue of crime. We wrote in the February newsletter about the January meeting that took place between city officials and Woodland's board members to discuss crime in Walnut Creek (article available on our website, www.woodlandsassn.org). As a result of that meeting, Walnut Creek Police Chief Joe Bryden tasked Sergeant Sean Conley of the Walnut Creek Police to liaise with the Woodlands Board to address the issues that the Woodland's Board brought to the city's attention. Sergeant Conley subsequently attended our February Board meeting where we worked with Sgt. Conley to plan a Woodlands community crime meeting. Sgt. Conley updated the Board on the most recent developments, and shared with us the following:

- Sgt. Conley coordinated and lead a meeting with the Citrus Center business owners that took place on February 16th, and included the participation of Woodland Association board members. This meeting discussed what steps business owners are taking, in coordination with the Walnut Creek Police, to increase awareness and strengthen security.
- Sgt. Conley also coordinated a community meeting for March 7th from 7pm - 9pm at the Valle Verde MUR, where the community can hear first hand what steps have been taken by both business owners and the police department to improve security in the shopping center and our neighborhood. City officials including Mayor Cindy Silva, Chief Joe Bryden, City Manager Ken Nordhoff, and Councilor Kish Rajan are expected to attend the meeting, and after Sgt. Conley's presentation, both he and city officials will be prepared to take questions from the audience.

Please take the time to attend this community meeting on 3/7. The more aware and coordinated we are with city efforts to combat crime, the better prepared we will be as a community to confront this issue. Please check the Woodland's website (www.woodlandsassociation.com) frequently to stay apprised of updates on this issue. If you have any questions you would like addressed at the public meeting, we strongly encourage you to submit them beforehand via our website e-mail, woodlandsassn@yahoo.com. 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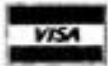
