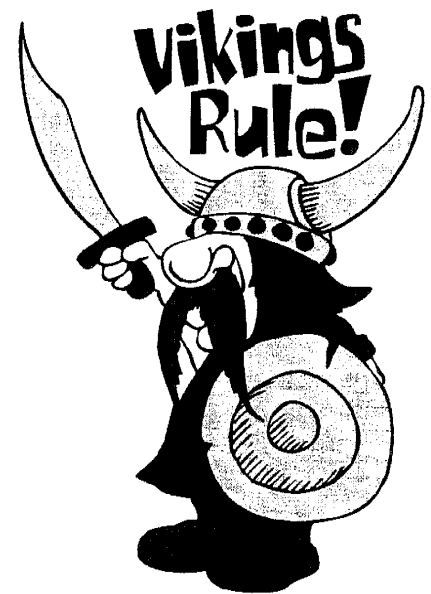

Games tickets and unlimited play wristbands will be on sale throughout the day and can also be purchased for Valle Verde students through the discount ticket pre-sale at the school.

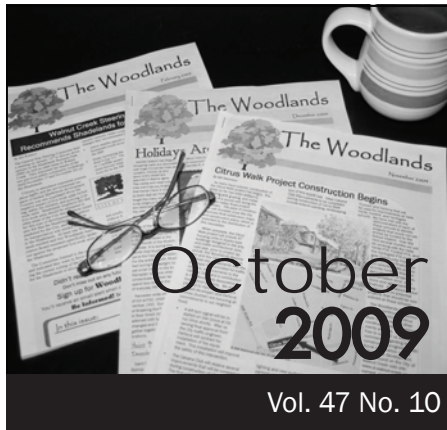

Update on City Government

The Walnut Creek City Government, to no one's surprise, is predicting a significant budget shortfall for the upcoming fiscal years 2010 - 2012. Though the city has significant cash reserves, local tax revenues are down, as they are in most mid-size California cities, and Walnut Creek has had to face difficult choices as to what and where to cut, and how deeply.

However, City Councilmember's, a number of which were recently elected at the end of 2008, are determined to resolve the long-term nature of Walnut Creek's fiscal challenges. In a recent conversation with our resident Councilor Kish Rajan, I learned that the city, through the General Plan process, citizen surveys, and ongoing communications with citizens, has identified six "Big Picture" goals that City Government will focus on. These goals are:

- Strong Neighborhoods and a Sense of Community
- Economic Vitality
- Effective Transportation and Mobility
- Stewardship of the Natural and Built Environment
- A Safe Community
- Culture, Recreation and Learning Opportunities

Later this month, the City will begin a series of community meetings intended to build on these ideas and to gather broad public input regarding your core values, goals and objectives for our community. This input will give the City Council and staff important guidance to prioritize the services we should bolster, reduce or even eliminate. The Woodlands Association supports the efforts of Kish and other City Councilmembers, and strongly recommends you participate and be part of these most important discussions.
