Warming The Patio

Here it is September already and in a few days the schools will be buzzing and the weather will begin to get cooler. So you might be wishing you could use your patio right through the winter. Maybe these cooler evenings don't have to cool your outdoor enthusiasm. What can you do? How can you keep your deck or patio comfortable regardless of the temperature?

I have been at several Woodlands homes recently that are using various deck heaters. You've seen them... and probably experienced them... at all the restaurants around here with outdoor dining decks. Maybe it's time to consider a deck heater for your own favorite outdoor space. If you have ever been warmed by one of these little appliances at your favorite restaurant, you know they can bring some special magic and enjoyment even in the chilliest of evenings. If you happen to be entertaining, they comfortably extend your house out on to the deck or patio and this can be year-round.

Most of these heaters are fueled by propane... the same fuel as your gas grill. Many of these heaters require no installation at all... just position where you want warmth and comfort. These heaters are also available in natural gas so you can tap in to your furnace's natural gas source in the house. However, this will require gas plumbing and normally require city permits and city inspections... even at home.

Some of the "southwest" patio heaters are fueled by the same wood you normally would use in your fireplace. I am sure you have seen the pot belly shaped terra cotta models. Of course many of the other wood burning styles are simply variations of fire pits constructed in the middle of the patio. Several companies even offer simulated logs for fire pits that use propane burners as a high-output heat source.

The propane-fueled heaters operate on the principle of simple infrared radiant heat and reflection. They generate amazingly good heat using very little energy. It is essentially the same radiant warmth you feel from the sun... but don't expect patio heaters to give off any useable light. They are surprisingly efficient and quite inexpensive to operate.

The most common heaters are basically a roll-about "post" with a propane gas grill tank hidden in the base. At the top of the post is a burner grid plus a reflector about eight feet up. They look a bit like a big floor lamp. One click of one button and they are generating heat. Generally, one unit can handle a deck of up to about 1,000 square feet. They come in a bunch of (continued on page 2)

colors so they can blend in well. One propane tank will last ten to twenty hours depending on the heat setting. For most types of weather that we experience here around the Woodlands your tank should last closer to twenty hours.

If you have a roof or trellis over your deck, you can attach or hang the burner and reflector to the trellis or roof beams and position the tank out of site. This is the way most of the natural gas heaters are installed as well. Of course you limit the flexibility of moving the warmth where you want it when you install a heater this way.

There is also a small lightweight heater that you can mount directly on top of your propane tank. This type is called a directional heater. The reflector and burner assembly can be aimed directly at a small area where people are sitting. These models tend to be the least expensive of the gas heaters and are certainly the most portable.

The least expensive way to warm the deck is with natural wood burners. The terra cotta pottery styles are often quite esthetically pleasing. They crackle and pop just like your fireplace and they radiate heat in all directions. There is also a wood burning steel fire pit that can be wheeled about that also radiates heat in all directions. These tend to take up a lot of space on the patio but do work really well.

Think a lot about safety when using these devices. The big builder outlets and hardware stores that carry these items usually have someone to speak with about safety and installation tips.

September has arrived. Here is to year round comfort on your deck.
