Bicycle – Pedestrian Bridge Proposed Over Ygnacio Valley Road

Committee Forming to Establish Safe Crossing at Busy Intersection By Adrienne Robillard

As the walls for the 55,000 square foot Lifestyle Safeway go up in the new Orchards development, there is a revived interest in the proposal for a pedestrian and bicycle bridge over Ygancio Valley Road (YVR) near Oak Grove Road to establish safe passage across this heavily trafficked regional roadway. This intersection is utilized by area bicyclists and pedestrians with destinations including Ygnacio Valley Library and Mt. Diablo as well as students going to and from area schools. If you are interested in joining engaged community members to explore the proposal for a bridge (or alternative) solution and make a difference in the future of our community, email yvroakgrovecrossing@gmail.com. City staff emphasized that it takes a team of dedicated individuals to affect change of this level.



According to the traffic study conducted by a 3rd party for The Orchards development, 57,000 cars currently pass through the Ygnacio Valley Road at Oak Grove Road intersection daily, often at speeds of 50 mph+, and the traffic will soon increase with completed development of The Orchards shopping center (featuring a children's park, Lifestyle Safeway, gym, restaurants and senior living center) and the remodeling of Encina Grande Shopping Center, with Whole Foods as the new anchor tenant, a 24-Hour drive-thru Walgreens and a variety of restaurants and services.

This is not the first time a bridge has been proposed. Enhancements to the current crossing as well as a bridge have been suggested in the past. Some enhancements to the intersection, like a sharper right turn from Oak Grove to head west on Ygnacio (to slow drivers and allow for more passage time for non-motorists) are already part of The Orchards plan. After gathering feedback and input from Woodlands residents face-to-face, via NextDoor and Facebook, and meeting with Walnut Acres PFC President, Cherise Khaund, Valle Verde Elementary PTA President, Brandi Klintworth, the Woodlands Association set up a meeting with Rafat Raie, Traffic Engineer, and Ethan Bindernagel, Interim Economic Development Manager (who was the city's Senior Planner on The Orchards project) to discuss the bridge proposal on Thursday, November 12th. During the meeting, which included both Woodlands and Northgate residents, different scenarios were considered. Mr. Raie said a bridge over the intersection is more realistic than a tunnel under, and a roundabout will not work. Mr. Bindernagel suggested voicing support for this project at Contra Costa Transit Authority's (CCTA) public meetings as this agency prioritizes funding for future projects. The Woodlands Association raised the need for a safe crossing solution to the attention of the Contra County Transit Authority board during their monthly meeting on Wednesday, November 18th. CCTA Chair, Julie Pierce, recommended bringing this up with the City of Walnut Creek, as the area is also under the city's jurisdiction, which we have done. Both agencies are now aware of the public's interest in a safe crossing solution.

During the meeting at City Hall, both Bindernagel and Raie recommended not limiting the proposal to a bridge at this time. The City of Walnut Creek plans to measure how The Orchards and the revamped Encina Grande shopping center affect traffic when both shopping centers are open and to determine from that data how to allocate possible funds toward a project such as a bridge. Both centers are expected to open about 1 year from now, in the fall of 2016. As stated on its website, www.shadelands.org, The Shadelands Business park is also "...transitioning from a business park into a progressive, vibrant, multi-use destination – will be an innovative Walnut Creek community. The emerging development will also bring mixed-use commercial, retail, and restaurants to Shadelands for both tenants and visitors to enjoy." The transformation of The Shandelands will also impact area traffic.

In the meantime, the Woodlands Association published an online petition to determine community support and gather input for a pedestrian and bicycle bridge proposal at https://www.change.org/p/city-council-of-walnut-creek-support-a-pedestrian-and-bicycle-bridge-over-ygnacio-valley-road.

The proposal launched on change.org just before noon on Wednesday, 11/11/15, and in less than 48 hours it had over 350 signatures. At the time of printing, there are over 400 signatures. The Woodlands Association has connected with Bike Walnut Creek and Bike Concord and is reaching out to key stakeholders including the shopping center owners, business owners like Rocco Biale, The Shadelands Property and Business Improvement District (PBID), and Walnut Creek's City Council to discuss this vision further, gather input and work toward a safe-crossing solution that will serve the community into the future.

City Responds to Speeding Concerns in the Woodlands

As you may have seen, there has been an active presence from the Walnut Creek Police Department (WCPD) in the neighborhood to deter speeding, after numerous reports around the neighborhood were received. Officer Mike Adams relayed that the WCPD has written tickets, reminding drivers to keep to the limit and drive safely. WCPD placed a radar trailer on Citrus Avenue, on loan from the Sheriff's Department, as "a reminder for the drivers to watch their speed. The WCPD has purchased new radar trailers and is in the process of training several employees on how to move them and set them up. These new trailers should be available within the next few weeks." Officer Adams emphasized that most of the people WCPD has been stopping are area residents to the area.

The WCPD recently purchased a radar unit that captures and collects the speeds of vehicles. This unit was placed on Peachwillow and the information will be downloaded to give WCPD an idea of the actual speeds on the street in front of Valle Verde School for a duration of six days, starting with Saturday October 31st. WCPD has been moving the radar around the neighborhood to record speeds. This device is a tool the WCPD uses to help target enforcement efforts.

Rafat Raie, Traffic Engineer for the City of Walnut Creek, has also responded to our stop sign requests along Peachwillow: "I received the petition. I appreciate your interest and your efforts to educate neighbors and promote traffic safety. We will evaluate your request for a four-way stop at the intersection of Candleberry Road and Peachwillow Lane. We will also count and review the safety history of Peachwillow and Banyan Circle...We will share our findings with you as soon as we are done. We will try to collect the data before the Thanksgiving Holiday. Our goal is to get back to you by the second week of December."

City Traffic Engineer Simin Timuri will be meeting with us in the Woodlands to review the areas of concern and the possible traffic calming measures the week of Thanksgiving. The Woodlands Association will continue to keep residents up to date on this project via NextDoor, The Woodlands Facebook page and this newsletter.

Remember, it is up to us to enforce the speed limit of 25 mph with our own driving. Slow down and stay safe.

Prepare for Waterworld

Life is a series of transitions. Every birthday, every season marks a new change. This fall is no different, as we shift from several years of drought to a wet, El Niño driven winter deluge.

With the expected oncoming onslaught of water pouring forth from the heavens, many of us are faced with a real challenge – how to transition our arid lawn remnants from patches of dirt and scattered dead grass to something other than a mud puddle when the spigot opens up from above. Looking at the patch of what was once grass in my backyard, I was moved to consider my options. What do you do when you know that the status quo will not work?

The first option for making your outdoor space winter ready is to make it more drought tolerant by taking out grass and using ground cover like mulch or rocks as a replacement. For those who would like to bring their lawns back to life, the resuscitation is achievable for even those without a doctorate in botany.

To begin, spreading new soil or some compost over the entire area will allow new grass to have a solid base from which to sprout. If you believe the best fix is a quick one, this is the stage where you want to lay down new sod. Alternatively, if you want a less expensive return to life for your yard, grass seed can be spread over the lawn. The challenge with seed is that too much water can be as deadly as no water during the first two weeks.

In addition, with many trees having died, it can be smart to remove dead wood before rain soaks it and causes it to fall. Numerous local tree services will make house calls – a licensed arborist can tell you which trees need to be pruned and which ones should be removed. My rule of thumb is that if I haven't seen a sign of life in months, the tree is coming out before it comes down in a winter storm. Now get out there and get ready for the rainy season before your yard becomes a bottomless mud pit, apt to swallow small creatures and shoes without remorse.

RECIPE: Sausage, Kale & Vegetable Soup

This soup is great to have on hand for those days when a hearty soup is the only way to fend off the chill in the air. This is a great mixture of hearty vegetables and is a great way to balance the holiday indulgences. Think about making an extra batch for the freezer to have on hand throughout the season. Kale, root vegetables and Italian sausage make a great match, but feel free to switch up the ingredients with your favorites!



2 Mild Italian Sausages, casings removed 2 Tablespoons Extra Virgin Olive Oil 1 large onion, diced 2 red bell peppers, diced 2 large carrots, peeled & diced 3 stalks celery, diced 2 small turnips, peeled and diced 1 1/2 teaspoons kosher salt, more as needed Freshly ground pepper, to taste 5 garlic cloves, minced 2 teaspoons paprika 1 28 oz can whole peeled tomatoes, pureed 1 bunch Tuscan kale- large ribs removed and chopped 2 fresh bay leaves 1 teaspoon minced rosemary 32 oz. Chicken Broth

Heat wide bottomed soup pot over medium heat. Cook the sausage (casings removed) in pot breaking up with spoon. Cook through, remove from pot and set aside- do not drain pot. Add 2 Tablespoons of olive oil and the onion, peppers, carrots, celery and turnips. Sprinkle with 1 teaspoon of salt and pepper and cook over medium heat until onion has softened and other vegetables begin to soften- about 20-25 minutes. Add the minced garlic and cook for 1 minute. Add paprika and stir.

I prefer to puree whole tomatoes, instead of buying tomato puree, but if you prefer chunks of tomato, just crush the tomatoes with your hands or the back of a spoon. Add the tomatoes to the pot and cook for 5 minutes. Stir in the chopped kale, rosemary and chicken stock. Stir to mix and cook for an additional 20 minutes. Add salt and pepper to taste.



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
